He proudly showed off his hat and jacket they awarded him and told me about the plaque they presented him on the field. Twice a year I had to take over for him at the community meetings so he was able to attend the games. I'm glad he saw the last game of the season this year and yes, I heard all about it! Dave also loved shuffleboard. He took it very seriously and was always there every chance he could get. He even got his sister Cathy and nephew to come down to play. I can't believe I'm saying this but I think I will actually miss seeing those Hawaiian shirts of his! In his defense he did clean up nicely and looked very dapper in suits he wore to the Volunteer Dinners. He and I attended the award ceremony at the high school to present the Fawn Lakes Scholarship awards to the recipients this year. I told him he looked very handsome in his suit and I actually made him blush!

Dave was the kind of leader that trusted you to do your job. He assigned me pool management, getting a new roof, pricing and obtaining new insurance and various other projects, and then left me to do it. He was there to back you up if you needed him, but he had faith in you and your ability. He told me he probably wasn't going to run again and wanted to know if I was ready to take over. I wasn't, but I told him I was glad he would be my mentor and I could lean on him for his advice and know how. This was not how I envisioned things turning out. When people say life is too short, believe them. We never know what life has in store for us so listen to the cliches and live your life to the fullest!

I just received my December Fawn Lakes Press and read with sadness Dave's last Director's Corner. He was writing about the memories that were published in the press of Lenny Feather's passing and said, "I hope I am that fondly remembered when I go, but I doubt it." Oh yes Dave, people will be writing their memories of you, and you will always be fondly remembered and greatly missed.




Dave Roberts Remembered

I first met Dave Roberts more than a decade ago; and like many others in Fawn Lakes I greeted him with a casual: "Hi, how's it going."

This led to many short chats about our lives in general.

In 2017 the Fawn Lakes Press needed someone to replace a volunteer that delivered Elm Road and Dave mentioned he had just retired.

It took only a few minutes to recruit Dave to deliver the Press on Elm Road and accept an invitation to join me at the next Community Meeting.

Dave and I sat at the same table for the next few meetings. During one of them, Paul Cataffo announced he was resigning, and his Director Position would need to be filled; and asked if anyone in the room was interested. Dave gave me an inquisitive look, and I said: "Not me. No way!"

With that said, Dave raised his left hand in the air and said: "You got me if you want. You got me." I asked Dave: "Are you ready for this? They are probably going to make you the President." Dave with his signature chuckle said: "Yea, why not? It will be fun learning all the bylaws and everything."

Before you know it, Dave was Community President and his daily walks up and down every road become one of his trademarks.

I would often join him on his walks during the first few months that he was President and would introduce him to residents that I knew; and it would go like this:

"Hi, this is Dave Roberts. He is our New Clubhouse President. Paul Cataffo retired; so I am hanging out with the New Big Guy today." Then Dave would greet the resident and correct my introduction by saying that he is the New 'Community' President.

When on his walks, Dave took mental notes of every tree, street light, roof, vacant property, and you name it... in Fawn Lakes.

Dave was very versatile and no job was above or beneath him. A few examples of this are: He was the Editor of the Fawn Lakes Press for a short time, he delivered the Fawn Lakes Press, he would grill hot dogs in the picnic area, shop for our holiday picnics, do pool watch, pick up the trash with the Men's Club, referee clubhouse squabbles, and on and on.

Over the years Dave and I had many good and thoughtful conversations on the street and in my home. When it came to history or movies, I could never stump Dave, he was very knowledgeable.

Dave Roberts was truly an asset to Fawn Lakes and I am pleased to have known him.



In memory of David W. Roberts

Dave Roberts... what a guy! I was FLCA treasurer under Paul Cataffo and remember when Paul retired from the board. Dave stepped up and offered to serve on the board and fill Paul's vacant seat. I don't think he expected to immediately be appointed President. But he accepted the appointment and in doing so, began his legacy. Some examples that I recall are:

- Implemented an increase in the monthly fee paid by the three condo sections to ensure our finances would remain on a healthy footing. It remains unchanged to this day.
- He would take over writing checks and making deposits when I was absent from the area. We would keep in touch by phone call and email so I could post and reconcile the books.
- Acting as announcer/host of the men's club's "Nite at the Races" and naming the horses with a specific theme for each race.
- Starting each monthly meeting with "Quote of the Day." I've never met anyone with such an encyclopedic mind when it came to movie plots and dialogue.
- His love for Lycoming College and their football team. His unblemished string of game attendance for decades was unrivaled.

- His daily walks through all the streets of Fawn Lakes. Not only his daily exercise, but he was able to keep a handle on the neighborhood goings-on.
- His continual sunny disposition. I can't remember him ever being in a foul mood.



The cold weather makes it hard to get motivated to go outdoors and shoot, but there are some great photo opportunities to be had in winter. Make certain you dress for the cold and watch for ice!

Even when there is no snow, icy ponds make great subjects. Look for ducks, geese, or seagulls standing on the ice. Ice also makes for great reflection images. Many normal scenes take on a new meaning in the cold of winter

After a snowfall, there are great shots everywhere. The challenge with snow shots is getting the proper exposure. A bright snowy scene

tricks your camera into thinking there is too much light, so the camera will cut back on exposure. This makes the snow in your images look gray. If you know how to set your exposure compensation, increase the exposure by 1 stop to brighten the snow. If your camera has "scene" modes, use the one for snow or beach.

The bare leafless trees make nice silhouette shots and are very good for black and white photography. They are especially effective with a sunrise or sunset behind them.


