We are all aware of the age of our properties and that they have been in constant repair mode. Just like us humans, after so many years we need tune ups and sometimes replacement parts. An inspection of our trees has been done which will begin a trimming process. We will not remove or cut down any trees unless they are dead. The Board of Trustees will discuss and evaluate the concern with a reply to the resident.

It was an exciting day at the pool today. We had Don Miller come out and replace our drain cover. The state requires that this is done every 5 years. The clorine eats away at the plastic and it can crack and cause holes. If someone puts their finger through, or their hair gets caught they would be stuck by the suction of the pump and be trapped. That is why we have an emergency button that needs to be pushed to stop the pump. This is a serious situation and people have gotten caught in pools and hot tubs and drowned. The emergency button is on the wall to the left of the ladies room. Please take note of this so you are familiar with it in case of an emergency. Last year it was comical when we tried to replace the drain cover ourselves. We finally realized we were not going to hold our breath long enough to get the old cover off and replace it with a new one but it was fun trying. Well not really. We realized we were just going to have to pay a diver to do it for us. Don is a great guy and if you need anything retrieved or replaced in a pool or ocean, Don is the guy to call. Thank you Teddy for recommending him.

I have been power washing which has been a site to see. I'm getting better at balancing myself but from time to time I cheat and sit on my "wheely mobile" or use it to hold me up. My ankle is still swelling up like a balloon

and hurts at night from standing on it, but each day is getting better or so they tell me at physical therapy. Of course they were not happy when I told them what I was doing, especially when they saw the skin taken off the side of my foot by the power washer when I lost my balance. Its quite sore and difficult to get a shoe on but I'm managing just fine. The reason I mention all this is because I want to take the opportunity to thank Kip Bartholomew for our new gas power washer she found. The man who owned it couldn't get it to work so he gave it to Kip for free and she turned it over to Joe to fix. The guy put too much oil in and all Joe had to do was drain off some of the oil and it started right up. Unfortunately we had to buy a new nozzle and hose for it but we now have 2 gas power washers so two people can work at the same time. So hopefully someone can work inside the pool while I work on the sidewalks around the clubhouse.

Our pool monitor meeting will be on Wednesday, May 21st at 5:00 at the pool. Hopefully Mary Carroll-Dickon and Sue Fieger will show us how to use the AED and teach us safety measures at the pool again this year. Hope to see you all there especially the new monitors. Looking forward to another great summer at the pool!










Edward Liberge Award



- There is no entrance to pool without a pool badge. Wristbands for additional guests may be purchased for \$2.00
- Guests are not allowed without the resident. All members and guests must sign in at the pool monitor station.
- The pool will be open Memorial Day weekend until the week after Labor Day at the discretion of the Pool Director.
- Pool hours will be 10:00am- 6:00pm. Friday and Saturday the pool will be open 10:00am to 8:00pm. If no one is using the pool, or a monitor is not available, the pool will be closed at our discretion.
- You must shower each time you enter the pool, especially after applying sun screen.
- 6. Bathing suits and swim trunks only. No street clothes allowed in the pool.
- Children are permitted in the pool as long as they are accompanied by a resident.
- 8. If a child is not potty trained, a swim diaper is mandatory.
- Children who cannot swim, must stay in the shallow end and not proceed past the rope. They must be accompanied by an adult who is responsible for their supervision and safety.

- 10. Small pool toys are allowed as long as they do not interfere with others.
- 11. Diving, running and running jumps into water are prohibited.
- 12. No glass of any kind is allowed inside the pool area.
- 13. No smoking, vaping or chewing tobacco is allowed inside the gated area of the pool.
- 14. Pool safety equipment (painted red triangle on both sides of pool), must remain accessible at all times.
- 15. Long hair must be tied back.
- 16. Pool director, pool manager, and pool monitors are not lifeguards. You are responsible for you, your children, and your guest's safety.
- 17. No one is allowed in pump house except the pool director and pool manager.
- Everyone who works at the pool are VOLUNTEERS. Rude behavior or arguments with staff will not be tolerated. Check your attitude at the door.




