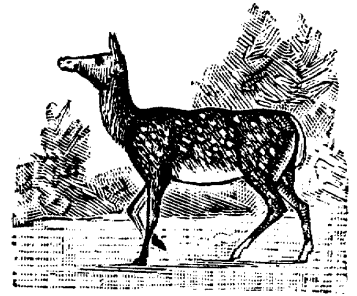

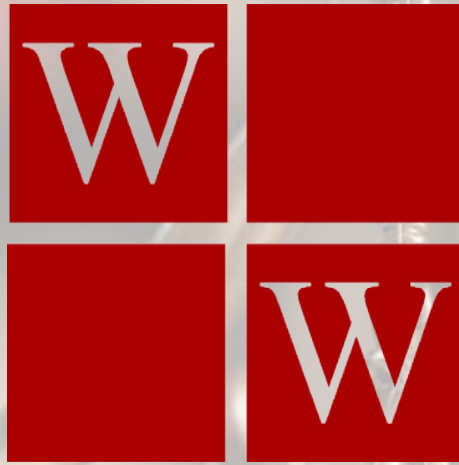

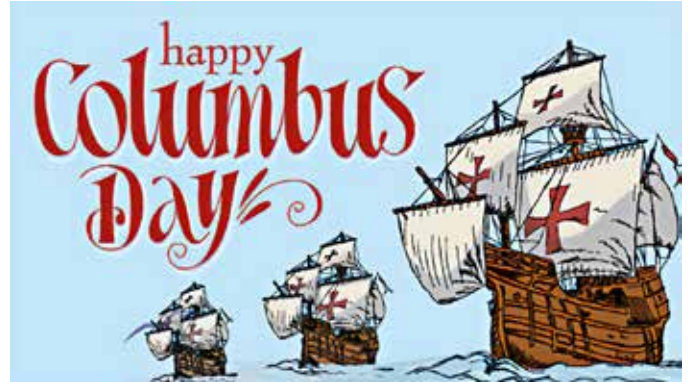

This is a reminder for all Condo One residents regarding work to be done on any unit, whether inside or outside.

Prior to beginning any work, residents must submit the following to the Condo One Board of Trustees:

1. A drawing or description of the planned work.
2. Contractor's contact information.
3. Proof of the contractor's liability insurance and workers' compensation coverage.
4. A list of all personnel who will be on site.

This written information may be given to any Trustee to bring to our meeting for review and approval. No work may begin until approval is granted.

Additionally, contractors may not enter any property crawlspace without explicit authorization from the Board.

Please note: if work is performed without prior HOA approval, the HOA will not be responsible for reimbursement of any costs associated with unauthorized contractors. This action may negate any further HOA coverage in your crawlspace.

We appreciate everyone's cooperation in following these procedures to ensure safety, accountability, and compliance.

All owners and or family must notify a member of the Board of Trustees before selling or vacating their units. Violating this notification can jeopardize the sale of your property. Be sure your Realtor is knowledgeable of what the fees and capital donation requirements are. Should you have any questions regarding your sale contact a member of the Board of Trustees.

We look forward to seeing you all at our October 4th Reorganizational meeting at 10 AM meeting; come early for coffee and conversation. The coffee's ready by 9:45 AM!

Notice of Annual Elections

Following the By-Laws of Condo A-3, the annual election will be held on the third Saturday of October (October 18, 2025) at 10:00am in the Fawn Lakes Club House, 6 Sycamore Road, Manahawkin, NJ 08050. On that day two (2) trustees will be elected: One trustee for a three (3) year term and one trustee for a one (1) year term. Other business related to Condo A-3 may also be taking place.

The Condo 3 committee trustees are continuing to get things done for Condo 3 residents. We have several resident windows that have been or are scheduled to be repaired. The outdoor windows have been painted, additional painting will continue. We are still evaluating contractors for lawn care and snow removal.

Any exterior work on the outside of the condo and surrounding area needs to be documented and submitted to the Condo A-3 Association for approval. The homeowner is responsible and liable for interior work/modifications. Check with Stafford Township for permit requirements.

For any Condo 3 resident dropping off envelopes at Claire DeLuccia's house @ 103 Ash, please put it in the box labeled "CONDO3" by her front door and not in her mailbox. Thanks.

We encourage proper exterior management of your residence (e.g. power washing, gutter cleaning, deck maintenance, etc.) These items are the responsibility of the resident and could lead to costly repairs if not maintained. If you have a planting around your condo, you must maintain the area, which includes removing weeds and trimming bushes. Bushes touching the condo create an entryway for ants and termites.

Reminder: Feeding wild animals (i.e. deer, rabbits, chipmunks, gophers, geese, kangaroos, etc.) is prohibited.

If you have a request or concern, contact the trustees; include your name, address, phone, time when we can contact you, and detail your request. Preferred contact is text.

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To the Editor:

As a resident of Fawn Lakes, I was both disturbed and disappointed by the article published in the August Fawn Lakes Press authored by our Association President. The content was politically charged, unnecessarily disparaging, and wholly inappropriate for a community publication that is intended to inform and unite residents.

This is not a matter of political affiliation, but of tone, respect, and purpose. The article lacked sensitivity and crossed the line into personal attacks and assumptions about how residents “feel.” Such accusations have no rightful place in a newsletter meant to represent our entire community.

While all individuals are entitled to their opinions, the Fawn Lakes Press is not the appropriate forum for political commentary, religious critique, or rhetoric that demeans one’s neighbors. Its purpose should be to promote transparency, civility, and community spirit.

Equally concerning is the inconsistency between message and conduct. After criticizing residents the President then called upon the community to refrain from bullying, gossip, and argument. Yet she herself engaged in the very behaviors she condemned. Leadership demands setting the example—not issuing directives that one is unwilling to follow.

The request that residents sign a “pledge” not to speak ill of others, and then submit that document to the very individual they may feel wronged by, is both inappropriate and disrespectful. This community is not a middle school. We are senior adults who have earned the right to be treated with dignity.

At its core, the issue is simple:

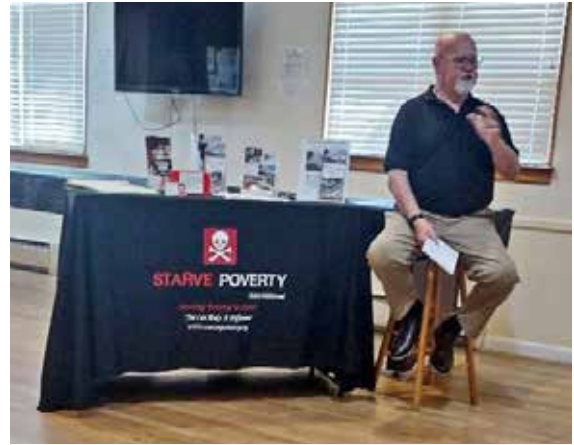
- Those who engage in bullying will rightly be called out for it.
- Courtesy is reciprocated when it is sincerely extended.
- Respect is only credible when demonstrated consistently.

Our community deserves leadership that fosters respect, unity, and fairness. The Fawn Lakes Press should serve as a platform to inform, encourage, and strengthen neighborly bonds—not as a vehicle for division or personal agendas.

FAWN LAKES CODE OF CONDUCT

We ask all residents of Fawn Lakes to make our community a welcoming and respectful place to live. As such, we expect our residents and their guests to treat other with respect and to abide by the rules in our Code of Conduct at all times.

If a resident experiences or witnesses unacceptable behavior, it should be brought to the attention of a Fawn Lake's officer or Director responsible for handling that issue. If any unacceptable behavior occurs in the pool area or at an event in the clubhouse, it should be reported to the person in charge. Residents are totally responsible for the behavior of their guests.

PROHIBITED ACTIONS:

1. Verbal abuse including insults, derogatory name calling and foul language
2. Aggressive or threatening behavior
3. Hostile touching or physical contact
4. Sexual harassment
5. Defacing, damaging or destroying any condo property or the property of other residents
6. Non-compliance with rules posted in the pool area, clubhouse and common grounds

If a resident is asked to stop displaying inappropriate behavior, immediate compliance will be expected.

CONSEQUENCES:

1. 911 will be called if behavior is deemed to be dangerous to others or to the person exhibiting the dangerous behavior or refusal to leave the area at the time an event is finished.
2. Written warning will be given to the offender by the Board of Directors, for the **first** offense.
3. A **second** offense within a **six-month** period of time will result in a **three-month** loss of privileges to the clubhouse pool, or area where the offense has occurred. A meeting with the community board will be required before privileges are restored.
4. No refunds will be given if a resident or their guest is removed from an event due to non-compliance with Code of Conduct Rules.

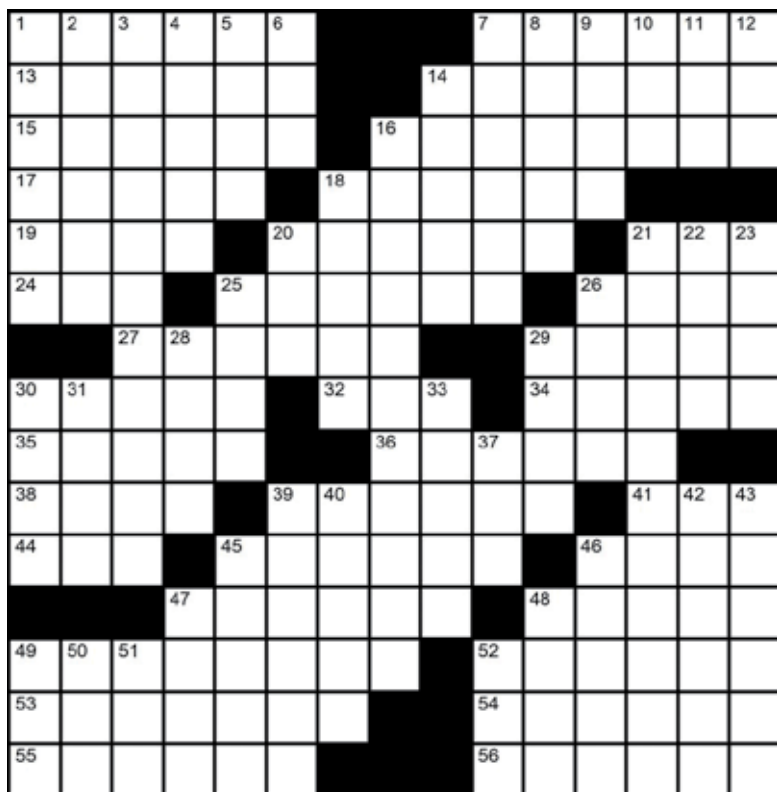

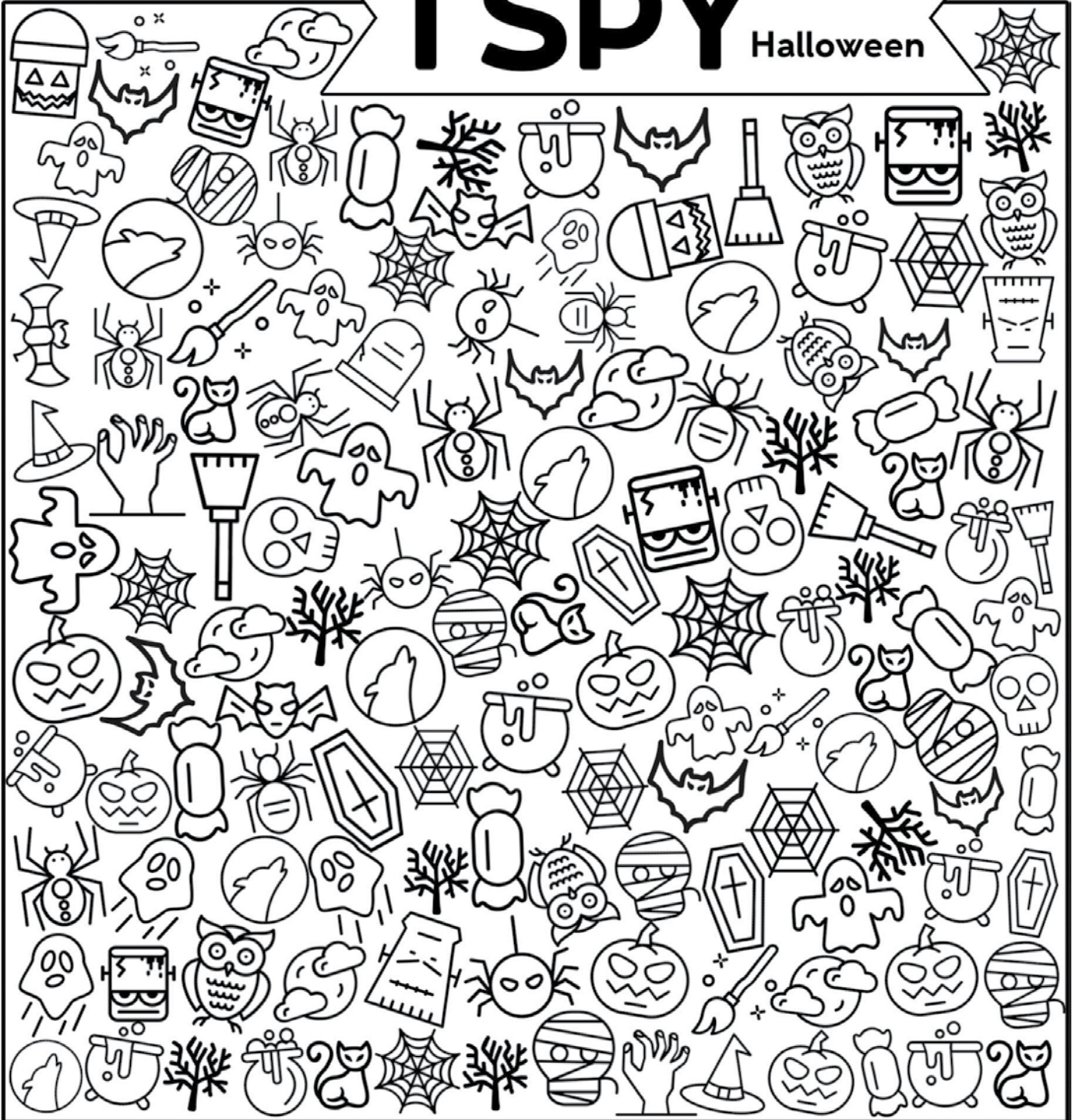

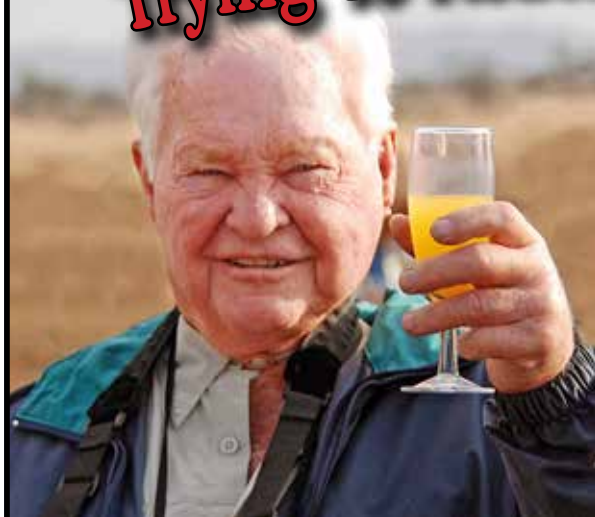

No More Blurry Images

Many people complain that their images are not as sharp as they'd like them to be. Several things could cause this, but the one I see most often is not holding the camera properly. This is especially true for the small point-and-shoot cameras that many of us use today.

To photograph with these cameras, you must look at the screen on the back of the camera rather than through a viewfinder (as with an SLR camera). You must hold the camera away from your face and body to give your eyes room to see the screen. This is not as steady as holding the camera against your face and looking through the viewfinder. While pressing the shutter button, people have a tendency to flex their wrists, which moves the camera and causes blur. It can also lead to losing the top portion of your image and cutting off the tops of your subjects!

To rectify this, simply press the shutter as softly as possible and make certain you do not flex your wrists. For added stability, you may brace your elbows against your body.
