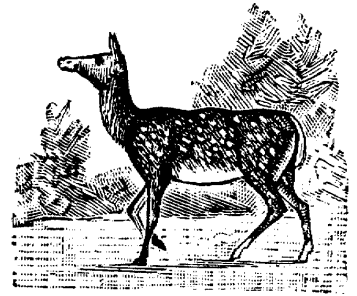

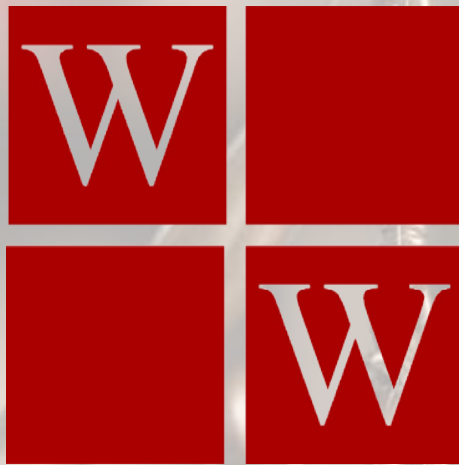

We covered a lot of territory and answered any questions that arose from the community. We all made it thru the snowstorms of February thank goodness! It was quite a feat and we are thankful to Josh, Mr. Bennett Senior and their crew at Bennett & Sons Landscaping for do a marvelous job of cleaning our driveways, walkways and front stoops. Although it took more than a day for then to complete the work we were well taken care of. Bella Construction helped us thru the first snow and ice storm and we are also glad that storm is behind us!

Carol Speller has volunteered to chair a committee to investigate bringing Solar power into Condo One. If you are interested in being considered for this committee reach out to Carol.

There is an increase in our HOA fees that is going into effect on April 1st of \$50. per household. As we are notifying you of the increase we are also asking that you upate your resident information form. We are asking for the updates to include your email address and current insurance information. The insurance should be for HO6 Condo coverage.

HOA dues are payable on ***January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1***, with a grace period through the 15th. Payments received after that date will need to include a \$50 late fee. Rates are:

Quad 1 Bed room \$517. Quad 2 Bedroom \$532. Duplex
1 Bedroom \$550. Duplex Duplex 2 Bedroom \$577.
Single \$601.

If unforeseen situation arises that makes it difficult to meet these dates, please contact our Treasurer, Geri Hartnett. She will offer the resident the opportunity to make payment arrangements. Open communication helps us avoid the need for further action. However accounts that are two months past due will be referred to collections, as overdue balances impact the community as a whole.

All owners and or family must notify a member of the Board of Trustees before selling or vacating their units. Violating this notification can jeopardize the sale of your property. Be sure your Realtor is knowledgeable of what the fees and capital donation requirements are. Should you have any questions regarding your sale contact a member of the Board of Trustees.

3.) Fawn Lakes Condominium A, Section 2, Bylaws, Book 4012, in part from Page 835: (F) Unit owner's obligation. Each unit owner has the obligation to purchase public liability insurance to protect himself from claims due to accidents within his unit, and shall purchase casualty insurance on the contents within said unit...

4.) Fawn Lakes Condominium A, Section 2 Rules and Regulations (in part):

2. Alterations, replacements, additions, modification or changes to the common elements or to any outside or exterior of any unit are prohibited by the Master Deed of Condominium A, Section 2.

16. Vehicles, trailers, boats, etc. may not be parked or stored on the common elements.

Well, we had a tough winter and as I type, the weather for the upcoming week will be in the 60's. We have some tree limbs that came down along Stage Road at the end of Ash, Elm, and Sycamore plus a whole tree that blocked Fir at the intersection of Cedar! I called the Township, and they cut the tree up and pushed it off the road. Thanks to the Township for coming out so quickly in the snow. The fallen branches should have been cleared the end of March.

The HOA fees are/were due April 1.

Here's a sign of Spring: Lawn cutting starts in April.

A couple windows cranks have been fixed. Requests for maintenance covered by the Condo 3 HOA need to be in writing and mailed or texted to the Trustees. If you tell me in person, I don't guarantee I will remember.

Bulk pickup occurs on the 4th week of the month. Only put items out the curb the weekend prior to the 4th week of the month.

I received a report and witnessed cars running the red light at Ivy Rd coming out of Fawn Lakes and going eastbound on Rt 72. This is very dangerous, let alone illegal,

as eastbound cars coming over the hill may not see you in time. If you just miss the light and watch the walk/don't walk timer, it counts down approximately 22 seconds then the walk hand appears. After a short delay, it counts down another 22 seconds then the don't walk hand appears and the Rt 72 light turns yellow. If you cannot wait the couple minutes, you can take Cedar Ave over to Ash Rd and exit there. From Ash it's easy to see down the hill in both directions on Rt 72.

FAWN LAKES CODE OF CONDUCT

We ask all residents of Fawn Lakes to make our community a welcoming and respectful place to live. As such, we expect our residents and their guests to treat others with respect and to abide by the rules in our Code of Conduct at all times.

If a resident experiences or witnesses unacceptable behavior, it should be brought to the attention of a Fawn Lake's officer or Director responsible for handling that issue. If any unacceptable behavior occurs in the pool area or at an event in the clubhouse, it should be reported to the person in charge. Residents are totally responsible for the behavior of their guests.

PROHIBITED ACTIONS:

1. Verbal abuse including insults, derogatory name calling and foul language
2. Aggressive or threatening behavior
3. Hostile touching or physical contact
4. Sexual harassment
5. Defacing, damaging or destroying any condo property or the property of other residents
6. Non-compliance with rules posted in the pool area, clubhouse and common grounds

If a resident is asked to stop displaying inappropriate behavior, immediate compliance will be expected.

CONSEQUENCES:

1. 911 will be called if behavior is deemed to be dangerous to others or to the person exhibiting the dangerous behavior or refusal to leave the area at the time an event is finished.
2. Written warning will be given to the offender by the Board of Directors, for the **first** offense.
3. A **second** offense within a **six-month** period of time will result in a **three-month** loss of privileges to the clubhouse pool, or area where the offense has occurred. A meeting with the community board will be required before privileges are restored.
4. No refunds will be given if a resident or their guest is removed from an event due to non-compliance with Code of Conduct Rules.

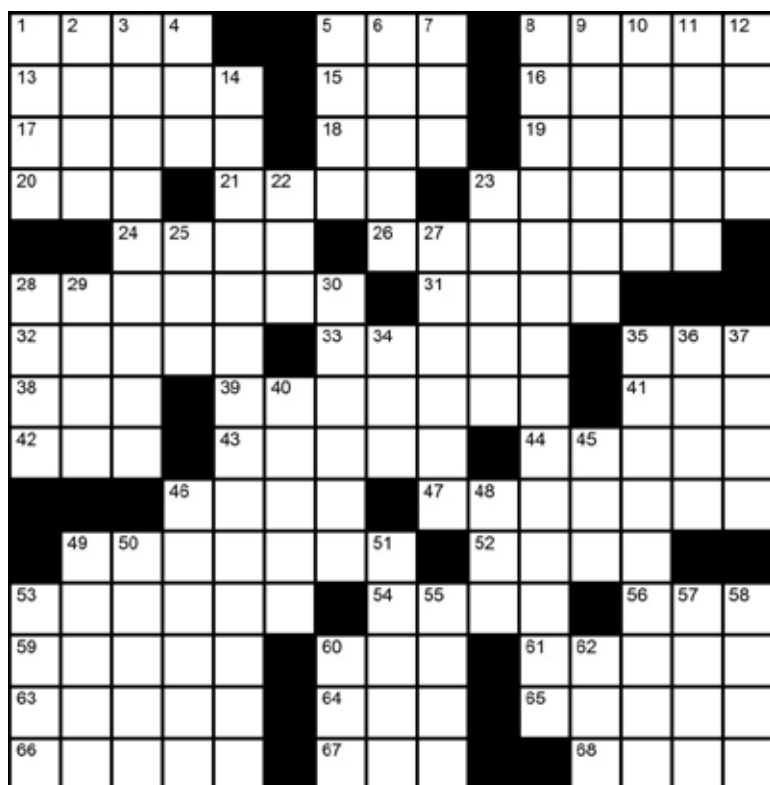

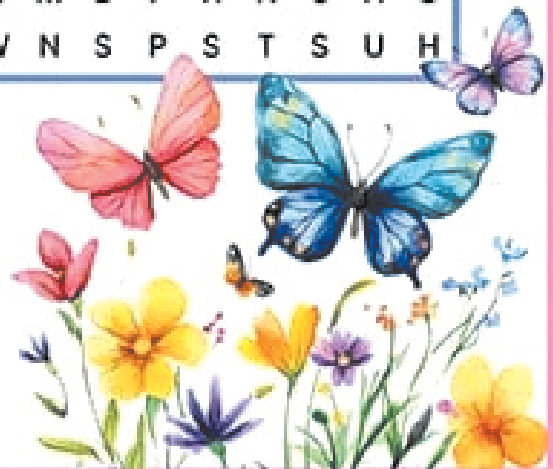
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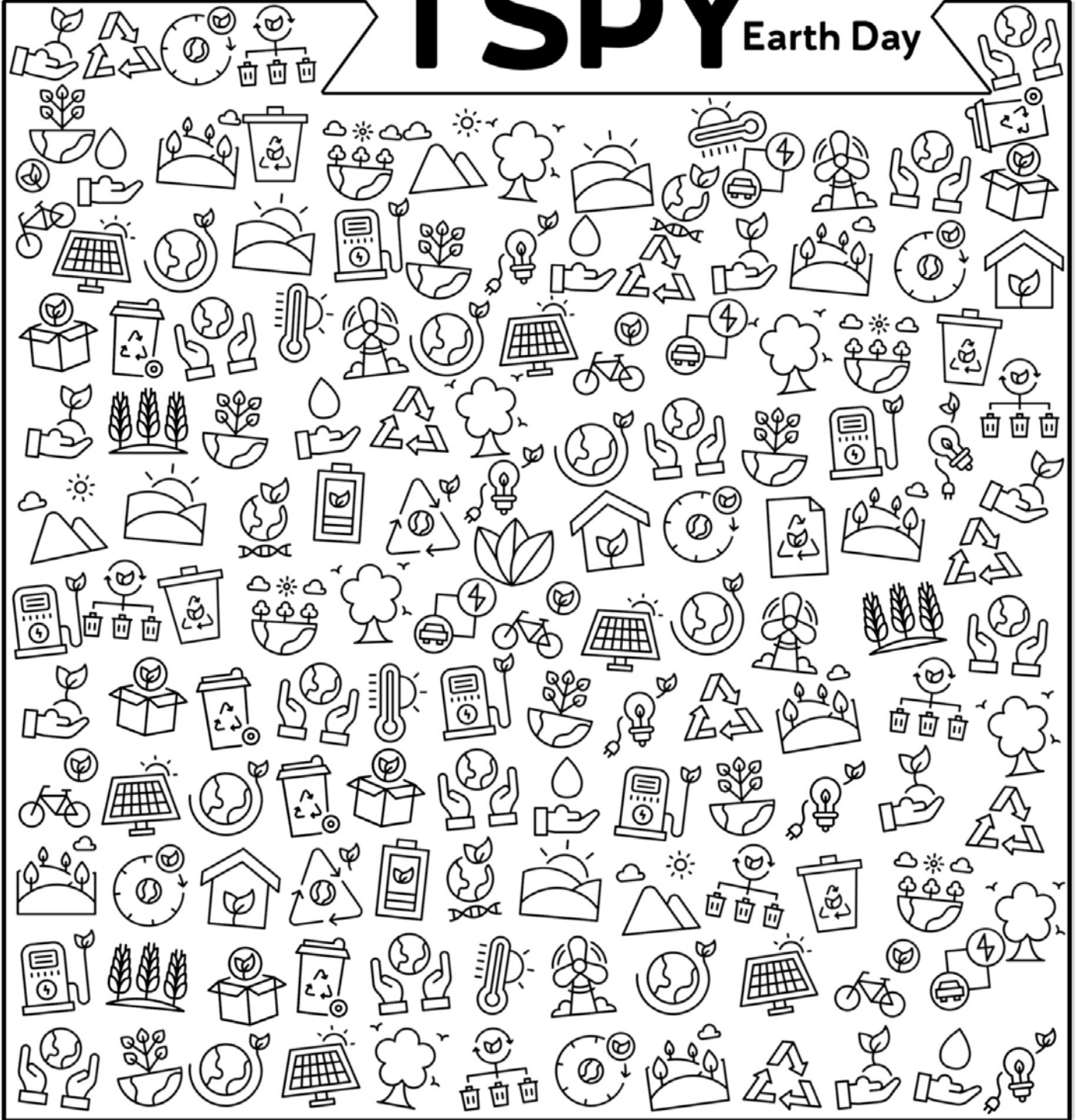
